
- Core Values

 - RIC might be a place people evacuate to in times of disaster.




- There have been a general increase in disgruntled passengers, employees, and people in general. Insider threats are some of the biggest the airport faces. TSA is requiring random employee screening. Might start next month.
- A pilot at Logan caused a major runway incursion. The pilot reported that he had been cleared in his mind.
 - Its easy to get into a routine and be on auto pilot. We have to be present in the moment to avoid these mistakes.




o Fuel Truck Flip

Change in injury rate for U.S. airport ground workers between 2019 and 2022, by select aviation services companies




About 60% of ground-handling professionals across the globe don't have enough qualified staff to ensure smooth operations, according to a May survey by the International Air Transport Association, a trade body. More than a third expected staffing shortages to continue beyond 2023.

Industry executives say the majority of safety incidents arise because workers are fatigued, inexperienced, or have been rushed onto the tarmac without sufficient training. Workers say training modules have shifted online in some cases, are required to be done outside work hours and aren't supplemented with on-the-ground training.

"Wages and turnover went through the roof at a time when people needed us to go from around 1,800 team members back up to about 5,000 in a period of 30 to 60 days," Hough said. "It was a madhouse."


Accident model

- Unsafe practices have a proportional translation into minor and major accidents.
- If we can reduce unsafe practices, we can reduce accidents of all kinds.



• RIC Safe

- o Spills
 - A broken piece of equipment was used, even though it was leaking, and it dragged hydraulic fluid all over the cargo ramp.
 - The K-loader was not tagged out.
 - The spill was beyond the scope of ARFF and the company was responsible for bringing in accompany to clean it up at their expense.



o Cart Flip

- The driver gunned the tug when pulling a line of carts and turned hard, flipping the last cart.
- Bags were emptied and cart was righted.
- Driver was also driving on a suspended license. His badge was pulled and a violation was issued.



o July Violations

- There were a rash of traffic violations in July.
- 15 total, resulting in 4 badge confiscations.
- 3 people were caught driving on suspended license.
